ReMBC - A Year in Summary

Program Funding:

We are happy to share that after initially being funded as a 5-year project, ReMBC has received ongoing funding from the Joint Standing Committee on Rural Issues. Thank you to all who have supported us over the years – now we can continue to offer the program for years to come!

Participant Numbers:

This year, **288 rural students from 19 schools** participated in our one-on-one mentoring program. We also reached the **1000 participant mark** – with a total of **1053 rural students** having participated since the program began in 2016! We also hosted **8 virtual visits for around 50 students total**.

We also welcomed **125 mentors** this year, **61** of whom were new to the program.

Thanks to everyone who joined us this year!

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Program Outcomes:

This year we completed an impact evaluation for the first 5 years of the program. We are proud to say that the results of this evaluation provide empirical proof of the program's efficacy in supporting rural students in various aspects of their transition out of high school, including career exploration, pathways to post-secondary education and much more. Description: Rural high school students learned all about applying to post-secondary programs from 15 of our mentor panelists, and met with admissions representatives from 10 programs.

Description: Rural high school students and post-secondary students learned from rural health science students and professionals about rural healthcare careers.

Description: Mentors and mentees finally had the opportunity to meet face-to-face in our virtual space on Gather.town. We played games, chatted and had a great time!

Knowledge Translation:

We presented about the program at the following events:
