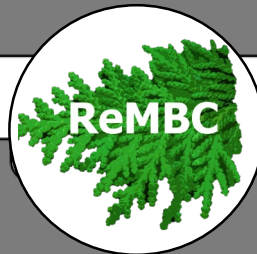

Impacts on mentors:

- Virtual communication
- Teaching/mentoring
- Exposure to rural communities
- Talking to teens
- Personal growth

Able to form strong

Engagement:

Mentees sent a total of 2162 messages

- Average 19 messages per student
- Average of 3 messages sent per module
- Average of 2 modules completed

Length of relationship:

- Yearlong or as long as they want: 11 students, 3 schools
- Less than 1 quarter (10 weeks): 26 students, 3 schools
- 1 to 3 quarters: 30 students, 7 schools
- Stayed voluntarily after class finished: 3 students, 2 schools
